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Key information:

Your level 3 equine course is a mixture of practical and theory lessons. You will need to be prepared to be working with the horses at some point most days of the week.

What you need to bring to college:

- Riding hat to the current standard
- Gloves
- Suitable footwear for working on the yard and / or riding boots
- Breeches or jodhpurs
- Sweatshirt
- Polo shirt
- Waterproofs
- Coat
- Pen and paper
- Your college ID
- Clothes must be a dark colour.

Please remember no jewellery can be worn on the yard.

Lockers are available to store your equipment and clothing for a £10 deposit which will need to be paid within the first few days

The level 3 course is four days a week 9:30am to 4:30pm. Your timetable will be shared with you in your first couple of days during induction

Your course will include:

- Your vocational topic- Equine Management
- Maths and English- depending on your entry grades
- A tutorial programme
- Work experience - internal on the college yard
- Industry Placement
- The head start programme

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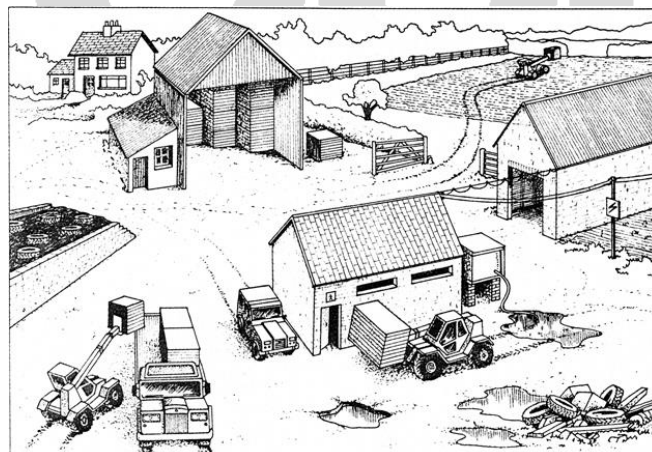
Task 2: Health and Safety
