Key information:

What you need to bring to college:

- Waterproofs
- Pen and paper
- Your college ID

Please remember no jewellery is allowed on the yard.

You can get a locker at the farm to store your outside gear for a £10 deposit on your first few days.

The level 2 course is four days a week 9:30am to 4:30pm.

Your course will include:

- Your vocational topic- Horse Care
- Maths and English
- > A tutorial programme
- Work experience; internal on the college yard and external at an equestrian business of your choice for two weeks.
- > The head start programme



List the signs you might see in a horse suffering from colic:						






Task 2: Health and Safety




